## Tiny Polka Dot game #7: Dot Five Memory

Dot Five Memory practices combining pairs of dots to make five but you must also remember where in the grouping a certain dot card is located. Again this teaches addition and it also requires the math skill of Conservation of Number. The Math Practices “Make sense of problems and persevere in solving them” along with “Attend to precision” are used in this game. Don’t forget to check out the Ideas for future games at the bottom of the card.

**As the parent educator, you will be observing your child to see how he or she conserves numbers. Can he or she keep the amount in his or her mind and remember where it is located? This can be challenging!**

Have fun playing this game several times and rotate in some of the previous games as well.

## Tiny Polka Dot game #8: Dot Ten Memory

Dot Ten Memory is an extension of the Dot Five Memory game. This time you will play by combining pairs of dots to make ten. Bigger amounts may require more time to learn but have fun with it. The Math Practice are the same as in Dot Five Memory. Don’t forget to check out the Ideas for future games at the bottom of the card.

**As the parent educator, continue to watch for the conservation of number and notice your child’s strategy for figuring out these combinations. Let them touch and talk!**
